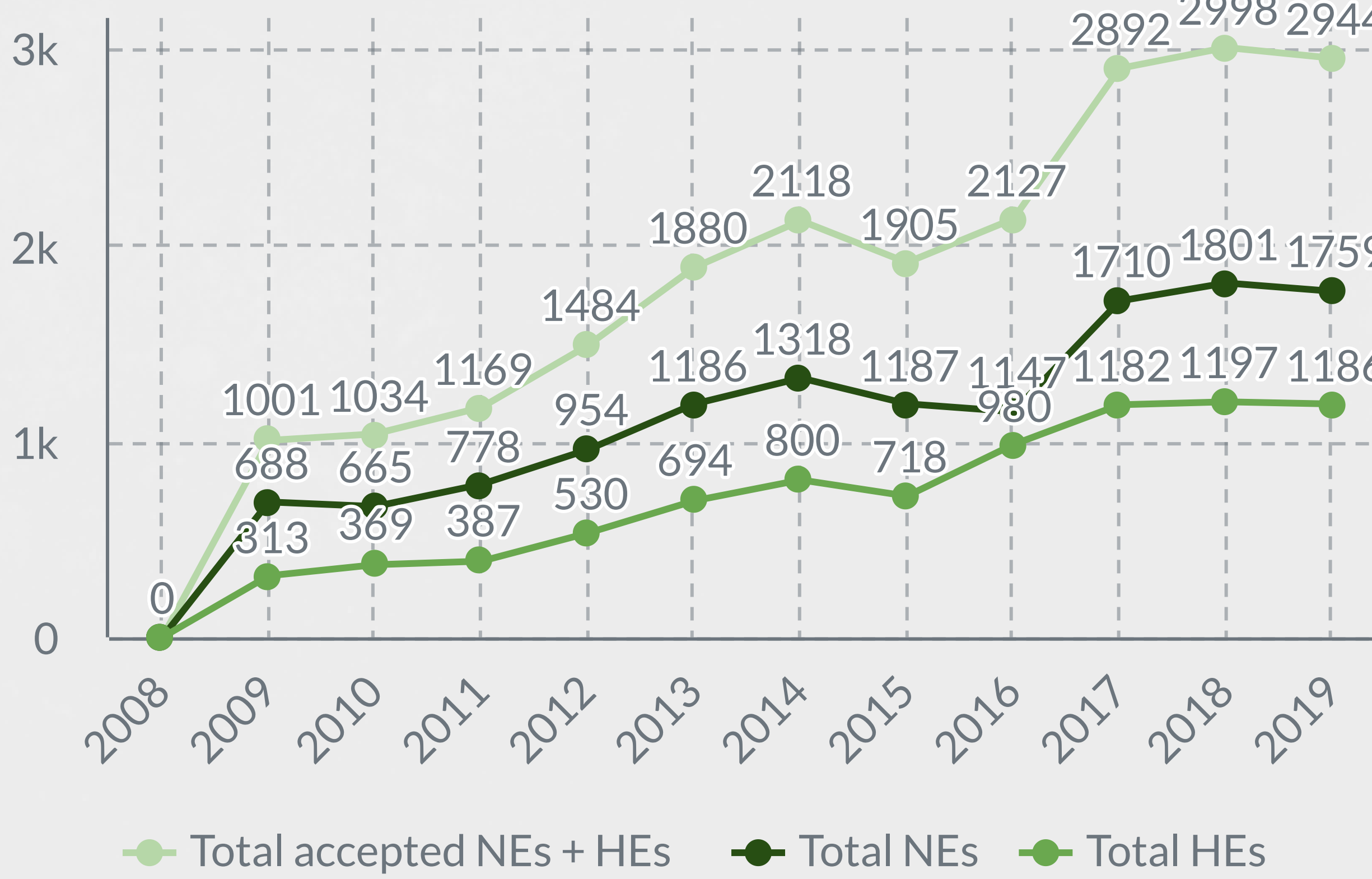
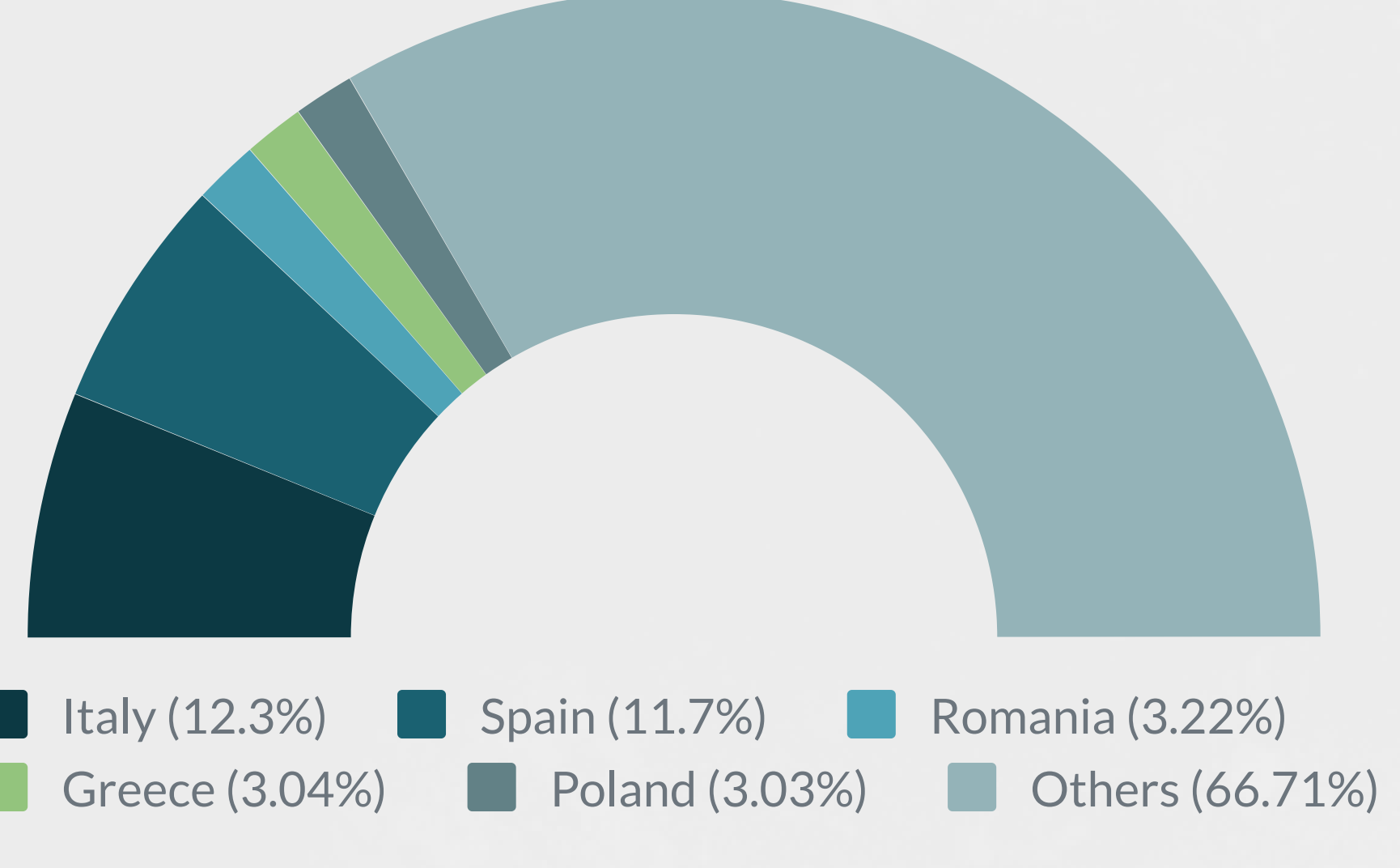
Since its launch in 2009, the mobility scheme has seen a steady increase in the number of applications, with 26,288 registrations received up to now. New entrepreneurs (NEs) represent 61% of the profiles received, whereas host entrepreneurs (HEs) make 39% of the applications. Spain is the most represented country with 18.8% applications received. Italy has the second highest number of applications received with 17.8%, closely followed by United Kingdom with 5.9%, Germany with 5.3% and finally Greece with 4.5%



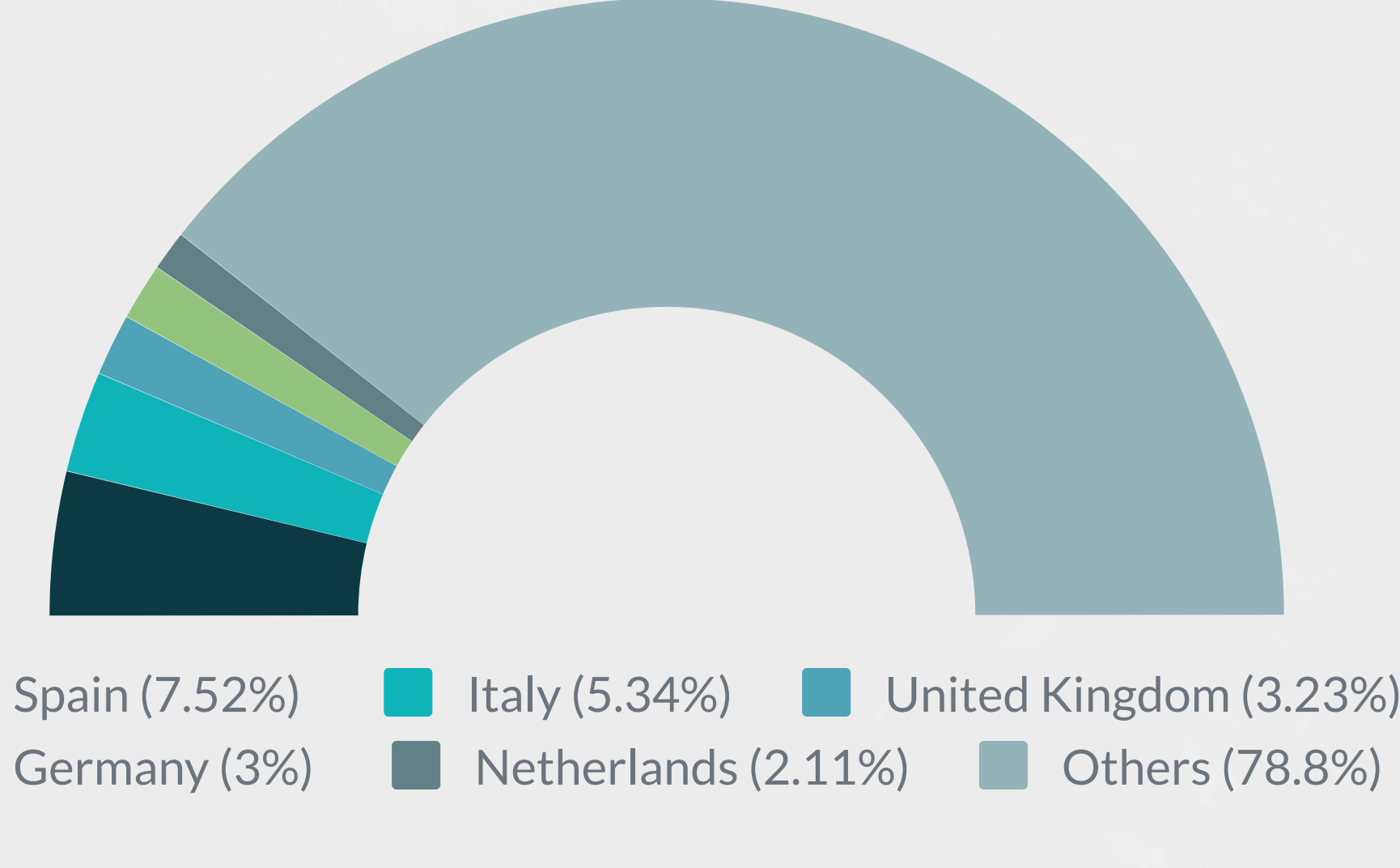
Top 5 countries of origin accepted NEs

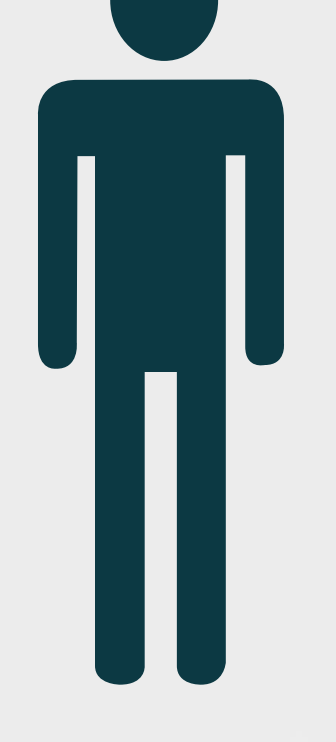
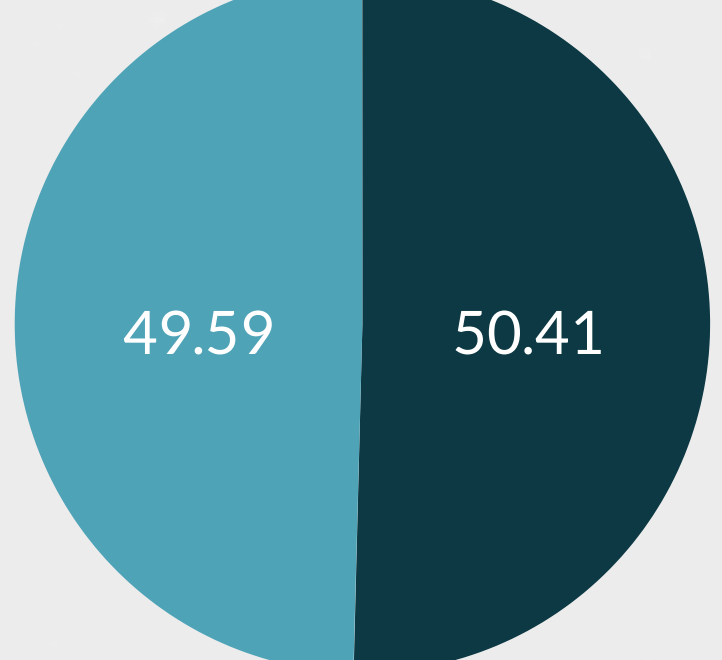
22,687 is the number of entrepreneurs who have successfully been accepted for the programme since 2009. This number represents 86% of the total amount of applications received. Accepted entrepreneurs are divided in two categories: new entrepreneurs, with 13,796 profiles (62%), and host (experienced) entrepreneurs 8,449 profiles (38%).



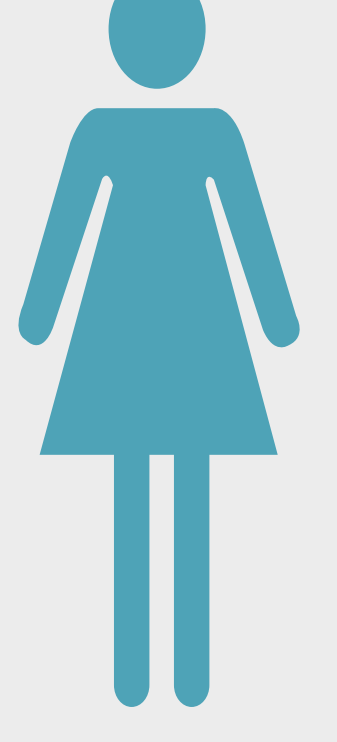
Top 5 countries of origin accepted HEs

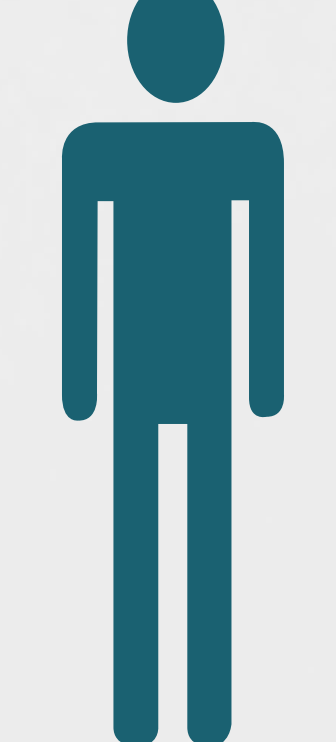

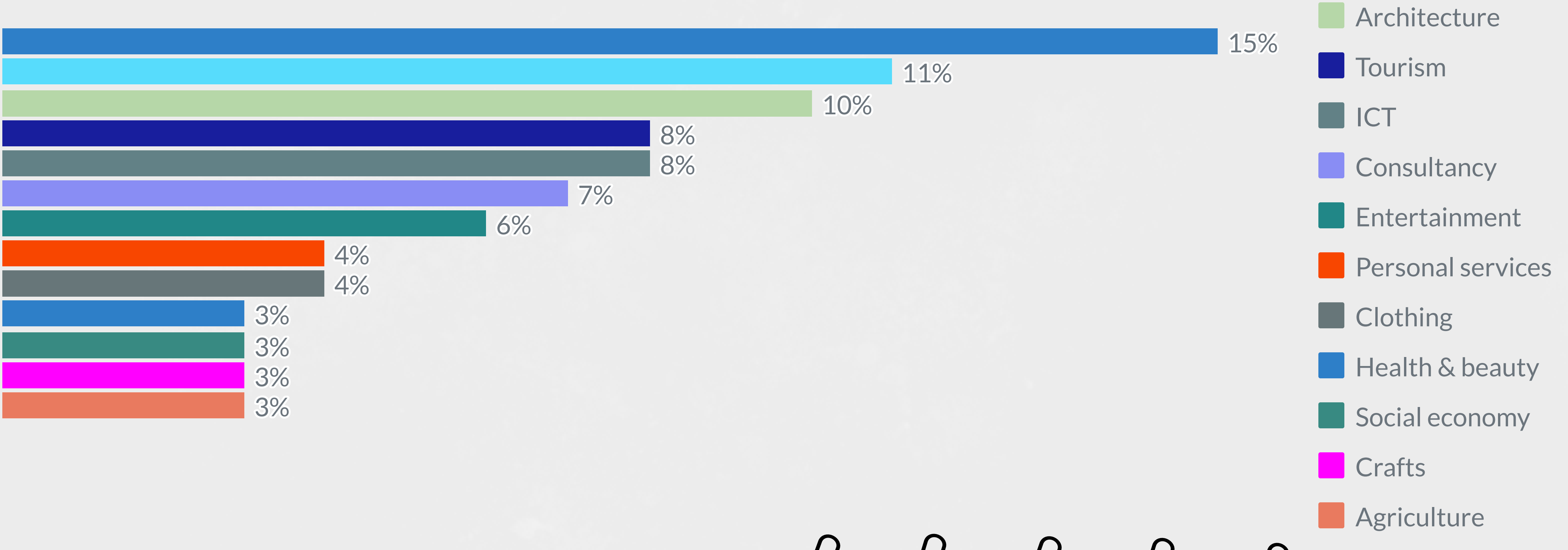

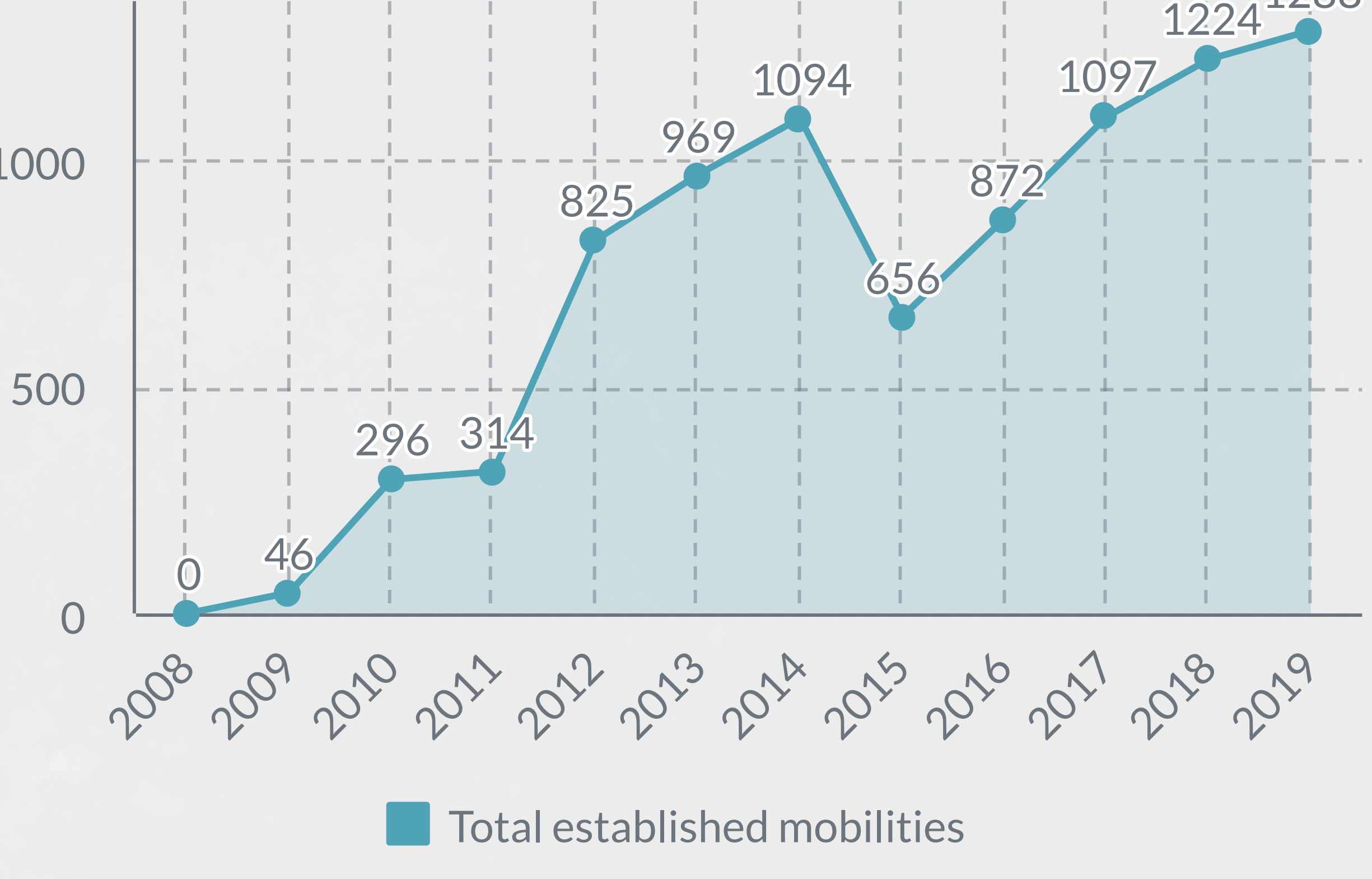
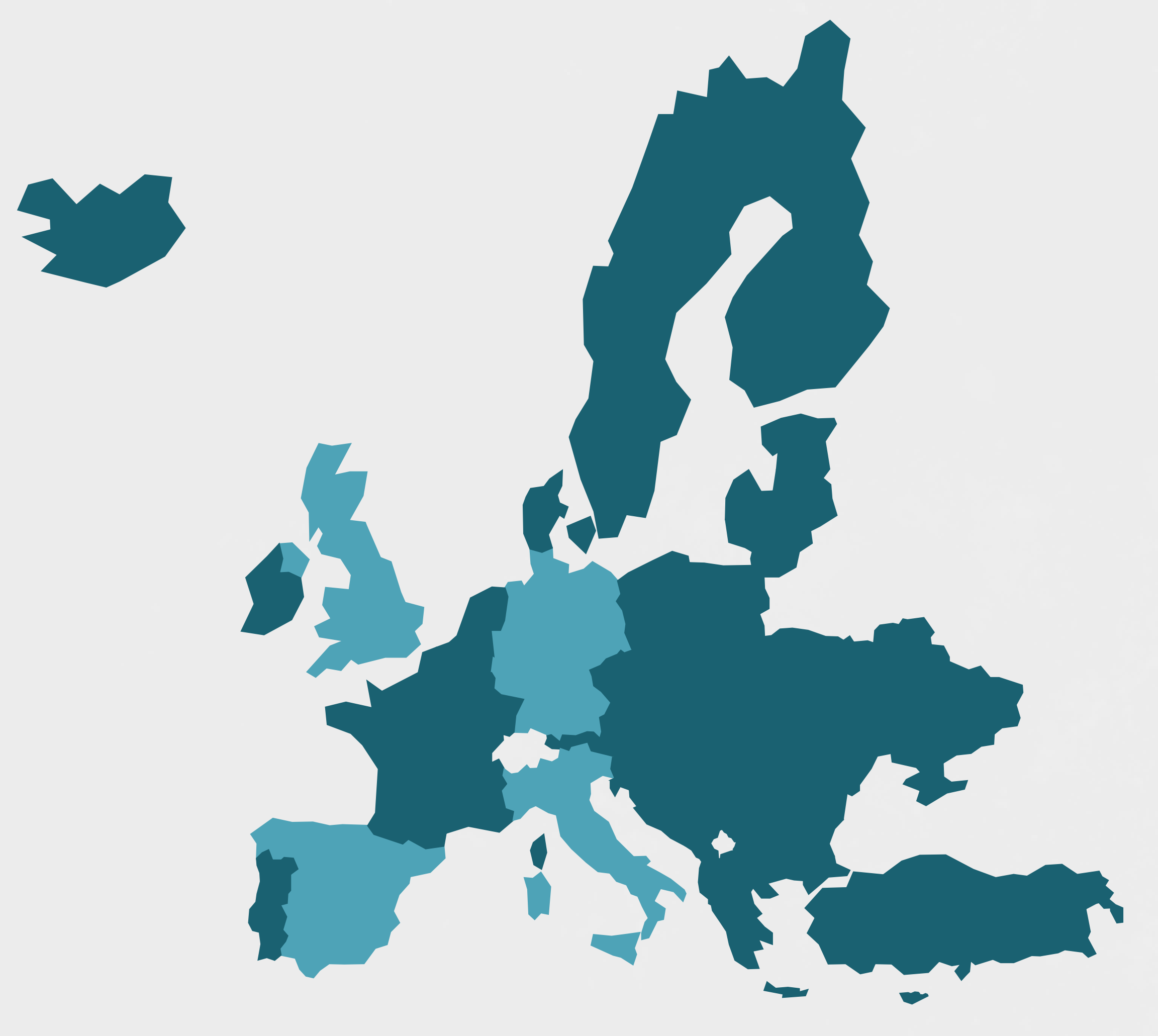
Sector of activity (NEs and HEs)



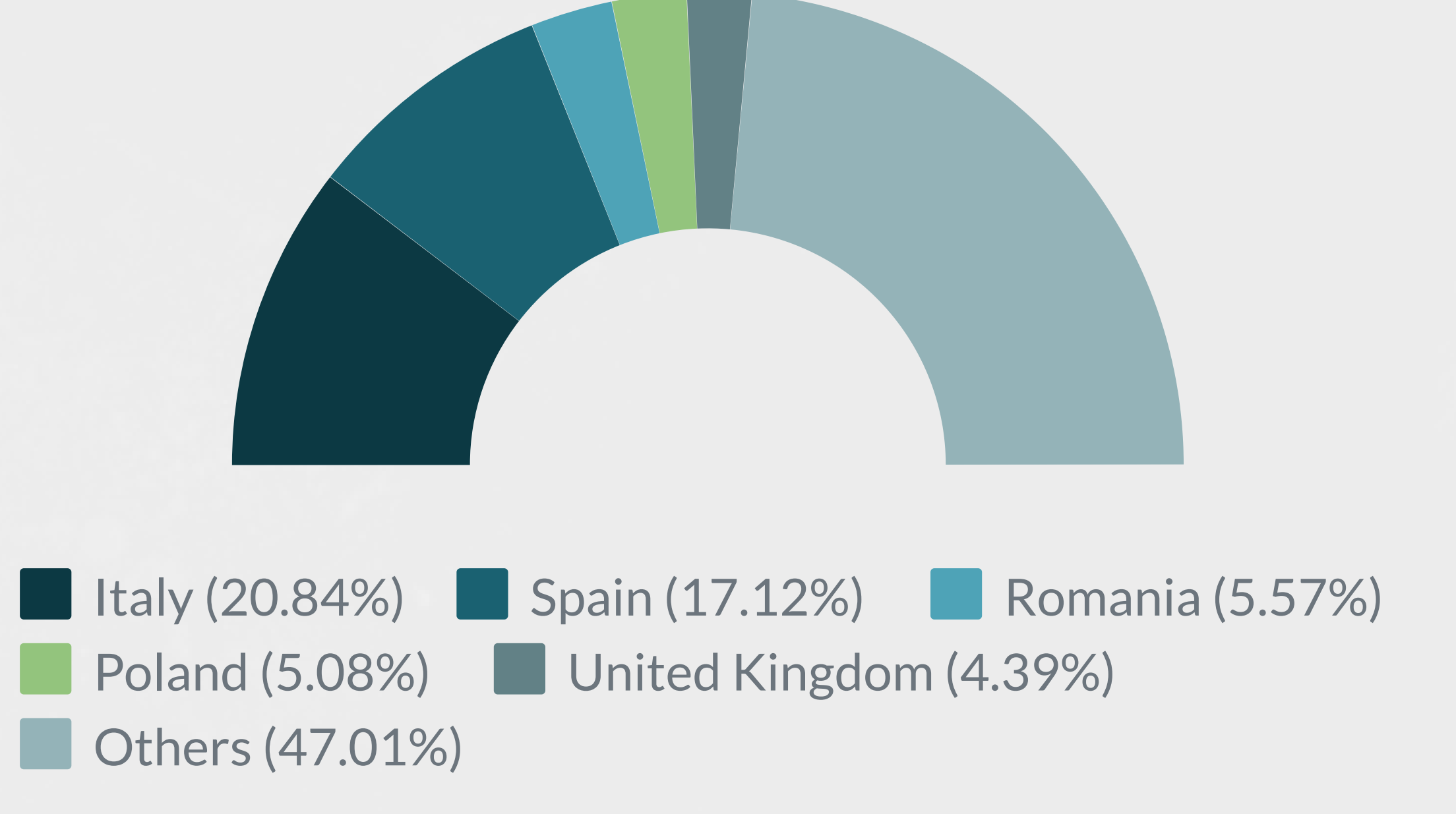
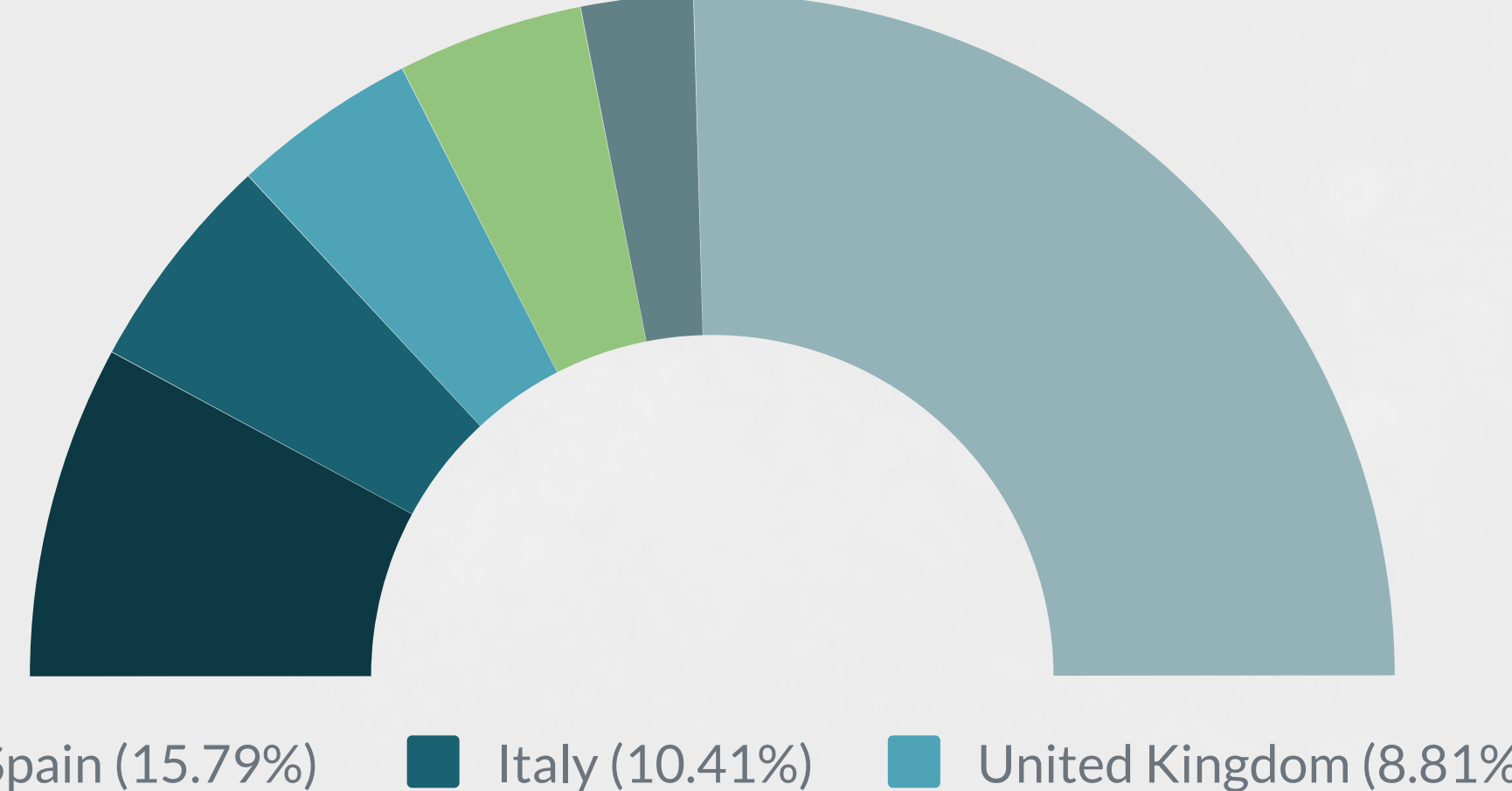
New entrepreneurs sent abroad by country

Since its launch in 2009, around 8,540 exchanges have been established, involving 16,000 new and host entrepreneurs from across the EU Member States and the additional participating countries of which 7,416 are completed.

Top represented countries

Italy is the most represented country with 1,780 new entrepreneurs leaving for another country. Spain supports the second most represented with 1,467 new entrepreneurs sent abroad, followed by Romania (477), Poland (435) and United Kingdom (376).
